Louisiana English Language Arts LEAP Grade 4 Remediation Ten-Day Summer School Lesson Plan and Pacing Guide

Notes for the classroom teacher:

Classes are 2 hours per day for 10 days. Each lesson is 45 minutes in length, and each break is 10 minutes long. Since many of the questions on the LEAP 8 ELA focus on Reading and Responding, the teacher should spend the most time on this topic in particular, with the remainder of time being used to focus on the other test topics.

Students are given timed sessions for the actual LEAP 4 test, but because of the short summer class, we recommend approximately 45 minutes for most sessions of the Diagnostic and Practice Tests with American Book Company's *Passing the Louisiana LEAP Grade 4 in English Language Arts*. With such a broad range of material to review in a limited period of time, this plan is designed to be fast paced and efficient.

A student *must* pass Math *and* English to go on to the next grade.

This guide is intended to serve the classroom teacher as general advice for how to make the most of the time available and maximize the number of students who will pass the LEAP 4. Each classroom teacher should feel free to adjust this plan to meet the individual needs of the student(s). Previous student test results or printouts may also be helpful in course planning.

Each 45-minute lesson should consist of a brief introduction/overview of the chapter(s), a few teacher-led examples, time helping the students complete the Chapter Review(s), and the balance of time spent reviewing the Chapter Review questions. Again, this plan has an extremely efficient, fast-paced format.

Based on the results of the Diagnostic Test, the classroom teacher is able to consider skipping chapters where there seems to be a general understanding of the concepts covered in that chapter. Some chapters will require more emphasis than others, depending on the level of understanding of your students.
